At the end of the galley is a Viking cooker with a Qasa rangehood. Even though the new parts of the house are more informal in feel, OPPOSITE PAGE AND BELOW, the attention to detail remains. Dark-stained oak joinery contrasts with stainless-steel benchtops and GE's Amana fridge. The wenge stools and suspension lights are both from Christian Liaigre. Tapware throughout the house is by Boffi. Artek's H94 dining table from Anibou is set with eight Fritz Hansen 'Series 7' chairs from Corporate Culture. This space opens to the pool area at the side of the property.
